Children are expected to attend school regularly, unless there is good reason for absence.

The Head Teacher is the senior leader responsible for the strategic approach to attendance in school. The school office will make contact with home when a child is absent, and the parent/carer has not notified the school of the absence. If no contact can be achieved or the reason for absence is not accepted the absence will be unauthorised.
